Title: Ephesians

The year is 61 AD. Rome is beginning to feel the pressure of its mounting taxes to supply its first, modern professional army. Public opinion of the need for such an army sways. In a move to alleviate the situation, captured Gallian soldiers are offered a choice—join the Roman army and work towards citizenship or die. They easily choose the former but are given only the most tedious and unimportant of tasks. It is these same soldiers that guard an aging Jewish activist claiming to have a new religion born out of his sect that is open to all. They grow resentful of what they consider a babysitting assignment. Meanwhile, the same activist, Paul, receives word from one of his prominent church plants that disagreement has erupted. Jewish traditionalists in Ephesus are arguing that formerly Gentile Christians within the congregation aren't on equal footing to them unless they adopt all their beliefs. Morale within the new converts in the church plummets as they feel like second class citizens. Seeing the similarity, Paul writes a letter to Ephesus declaring all Christians to be equal under God and detailing how the process of becoming a soldier in Christ is very similar, but also superior, to one used by Rome to make captured recruits into new citizens. Join us as we study and break down the details on how the Spirit led Paul in this unifying letter.
