Title: My Story, Your Glory (Discussion class) Teacher: Jonathan Palk (111-113A)

Everyone loves a good story whether it is through the pages of a book or on the big screen. How often do you see yourself as the hero or maybe one of the other characters placed in the background? You rise and fall as the plot thickens then are on the edge of your seat until the very end. Do you ever tell someone about what you have just read or seen?

Throughout scripture we read stories of how people's lives were changed once God entered the picture. Many times, after one of Jesus's miracles people cannot help, but share what they have experienced. God is still working today. Over the next 13 weeks you will be introduced to various people within the Body here at Hardin Valley. We each have a special and unique story to tell. You will hear about the many different challenges and obstacles that were overcome and about how their faith was tested, yet how God remained faithful. Come and see, come and hear what God has done, what God is still doing today. You may even be encouraged to share your own God story.

Title: Found in Translation *Teacher: Derek Dunbar (115A)*

In this class, we will be working to develop strategies for expanding our understanding of Biblical words, their implications, nuances, and artistic beauty. We will be learning about literary and linguistic theory as they apply to Scripture and exploring the immensely useful tool Logos Bible Software. Our goal will be to love the Biblical authors by learning to hear what they have to say on their own terms. Starting from that posture of humility will lead to a deeper understanding of the Bible and how to apply its message to our individual and corporate lives in our modern context.

Title: God Hear Their Cry *Teacher: Todd Chambers & Ben Buchanan (137E)*

In ancient times, nothing was bigger than Egypt. Powerful pharaohs, strong armies, and a multitude of gods. God's peo-

ple were no match against the Egyptians. In this volume of Ray Vander Laan's series ," That the World May Know" we discover how God answers the cry of his persecuted people and proclaim himself Lord to them, and to their oppressors.

Title: Hebrews Teacher: Graham Fox & Bill Brosey (138R)

"Hebrews" has one of the most enigmatic origins of all the books in the New Testament. Scholars have debated its author and recipients for millennia, and yet it has been accepted as a part of the Scriptural Canon since the first century. We will delve into these topics, but also see what Hebrews has to teach us about our theology of the Person of Jesus Christ, his role in the fulfilment of the Law and how all of this can apply to our lives in 21st century America.

Title: Questions of Salvation Teacher: Tom Rucker & Dan Reeves (140R)

The doctrine of salvation is one of the most important concepts for us to understand, because it is the difference between life and death. In this class we will dig into scripture to find answers to the questions that so many people have struggled with about salvation. Questions such as: What does it mean to be saved? Do we have a choice in being saved? What does it mean to be saved by grace through faith? What is the relationship of repentance to salvation? What do we confess when we come to salvation? Is baptism necessary for salvation? Can we say we are saved by grace alone through faith alone? What does saving faith look like? How are works related to salvation? How are rewards in heaven related? Is it: we have been saved, we are being saved, or we will be saved? Can we lose our salvation or is it once saved - always saved? What should be our response to the salvation God has provided for us? Come and let's build our faith together as we explore answers from the scriptures to these tough questions.

Israel has had its king for a little over 250 years. Civil war has permanently splintered the nation into North and South. In the north, an idolater reigns. To the south, a leper sits on the throne. Generation by generation, fewer and fewer people within his chosen nation choose to actively worship him. Yet, trade is booming throughout the region. The economy and the security of Israel's borders are at their strongest point since the days of King Solomon.
